	Severity high, likelihood small if controls implemented.	Signs to be placed at vehicle entrances to the site warning of runners crossing roads
Building/Maintenance works at various locations on the site	Injuries resulting from competitors attempting to pass through sites	 Contractor safety fencing and notices around the perimeter of affected areas. Competitors warned in advance (Final details) of possible, transitory, works and instructed not to enter such areas. Competitors reminded of possible works by Start Marshall.

Other people/activities in area The university campus is a public place and it is likely that a small number of other people will be present, even though it is out of term-time and at the weekend. Weather Excessive cold/heat, strong wind, rain or a combination of above	 Hyperthermia / exposure sunstroke Severity moderate but likelihood minimal at this time of year and with controls in place. 	 Weather forecast monitored regularly (KH) Event area relatively small and not exposed. Relatively short courses. Water available at finish for any competitor in distress, should the weather be very hot.
Equipment Electrical equipment	 Injuries as a result of trips & falls 	Cables stored mainly under tables and will not be where competitors or any other person will be walking. (BS/KH)
