Karen Cook spoke with Neil and I after the event on Sunday. She was really pleased with how her running and orienteering has come on this year and wanted to thank HALO. Neil suggested she might like to share her thoughts in the newsletter......

"We've been orienteering as a family for a number of years and we had progressed from a baby carrier to piggy backs to now the oldest two charging around by themselves. This freedom led to my husband, Lawrence, moving up to the medium course in the Poacher series in 2013, and this year was the first time I tried this new level. I soon became aware how unfit I was, unable to focus on my map reading and steadily at the back of the results. I initially started to do the government's health app 'couch to 5km' training plan. On my first run I wore jeans and my coat as I was so embarrassed to be seen as the overweight, red faced, middle aged woman trying to run but my distance slowly increased and I found the competitive nature of the orienteering made me run faster, if not always in the right direction! When the Poacher series was over we booked ourselves down for the Louth 5km and the kids did the 1km. I caught the bug in the next fortnight I completed the 5km at Normanby Park, Scunthorpe and then the Cleethorpes colour run in the summer. I'd moved to
